Amboy Township History by Wendy Meyer

Early History: A stockade, called "Head of the Little Cottonwood", existed along the Little Cottonwood River in the center of Section 24 briefly in the aftermath of the 1862 Dakota Conflict with a small compliment of militia. It's existence is documented by a St. Paul



Last train into Jeffers—October 16, 1979

Press advertisement dated July 18, 1865, requesting bids for hay to supply the garrisons on Minnesota's western frontier. Artifacts have been found at the site including square nails, broken pottery and a saddle pommel. The stockade was likely abandoned in the fall of 1865. Amboy Township was organized on October 10, 1872. Its name came from homesteader, Moses DeWolf, who lived in Section 34 and was from Amboy, Otswego County, NY.

Board Minutes: With 40.7 miles of gravel roads, board minutes are filled with discussions of road to be graveled, bridges to be widened, graders to

be fixed or replaced and the cost of business. Early meetings were held in homes until the City of Jeffers was founded in 1900 when the meetings moved to Jeffers. In 1961 a Quonset-type building in Jeffers was purchased for grader storage; in 1968 a building on main street was purchased and used as the town hall. Damage to the town hall in 2018 led to the construction of a new town hall/grader shed at the intersection of Peavey and Best Streets. Work was completed in 2020.

Rural Postal Delivery: From March 1878 to April 1900, the Red Rock Post Office served Amboy Township. Five farmers in turn were appointed postmaster. Consequently, the post office was located in five different farmhouses. Red Rock closed in September of 1900 when the post office in the new village of Jeffers opened.

Points of Interest: The intersection between Hwy 71 and Hwy 30 is known as Red Rock Corners, and for a time several businesses were located there. The Red Rock Quarry is located on 240 acres in the southern half of Section 12, from which 'red rock' or Class A Quartzite is quarried and used for many road projects in the area. Amboy Township is home to one church, the Jeffers Baptist Church, on Hwy 30, just east of 'the corners''. It began in 1907 but was not formally organized until 1916.

Wendy Meyer is a museum volunteer who loves to research local history. She also serves as President of the Board of Trustees.
